Abstract

**“Missional Insights and Suggestions through A Case Study of Cooperation in Korean Churches:  
Centered on Supporting Programs of Large Churches to Small Churches”**

This research begins with the question of how large churches in the Korean context today can help and support small churches in a sustainable way. To answer this question, the researcher conducted a case study and summarized the following proposals for successful cooperation between large churches and small churches. First, local churches need to overcome the localism with kingdom theology. Second, the local community is a mission field for local churches to cooperate. Third, the church is a missional community participating in God's mission. Fourth, Christians are God's missionary people. Fifth, local churches should seek to build a network based on a partnership with mutual respect. Sixth, when the cooperation of local churches is sustainable, it can grow into a cooperation movement.
